State of the Parish: St. John Bosco

St. John Bosco Parish will reach its 59th anniversary on July 1. During these years the parish has experienced significant changes. The number of registered parishioners has decreased and many costs have increased: utilities, insurance premiums, property and mechanical maintenance. What has remained constant is that core group of faithful and generous parishioners. We have thus far eliminated our debt in 2006 and been able to pay our bills.

Because we surpassed our CSA and CLT targets, we have been able to paint the interior walls of the church, repair the roofs on the school and the hall, replace gutters, replace the roof over the main entrance, rebuild the canopy in front of church, put new flooring in the vestibule and sacristy at the Beech Daly entrance, and restripe the parking lot.

After our school closed in 2002 because of a low enrollment, we have been blessed to have our school leased for a Head Start program which provides supplemental income.

Last June St. Hilary Parish closed. Archbishop Vigneron added its territory as well as its assets and liabilities to SJB, the adjoining parish. On February 6, 2015, Milliken Ford finalized the purchase of the St. Hilary site. Presently, we following are the Archdiocesan policy for the use of proceeds from the sale of church property. We have submitted to the Archbishop and his Consultors a plan for the use of the funds. The plan includes the payment of St. Hilary's debt and a substantial distribution of funds both to St. John Bosco and St. Robert Bellarmine, our collaboration partner.

With God's blessing and the guidance of the Holy Spirit we hope to continue ministry to the spiritual needs of our local community.

Letter to the Parish re: Our Debt

To the people of St. Robert's

This is Good Shepherd Sunday, the 4th Sunday of Easter. As your pastor and shepherd, I thank you not only for your kindness to me in the nine years I've been here at St. Robert's, but also for the strong faith tradition that the parish and the school have built over sixty (60) years. So many of God's blessings might be mentioned, but for the moment let's just thank God for all of them.

One blessing I thank you for is your generosity to *Changing Lives Together* (CLT) over the last three years. Through CLT we will soon eliminate the last of our Loan debt to the Archdiocese of Detroit (AOD) and that will be a milestone for us. However, as we rejoice over this accomplishment, another significantly rising debt is clouding our future. This debt involves our <u>payables</u> to the Archdiocese of Detroit (AOD) and to the Michigan Catholic Conference (MCC). The latter includes such expenses as health care premiums and pension payments for our parish staff and school staff, including our dedicated teachers. The former mostly involves the assessments we owe the Archdiocese from our weekly collections (excepting our Christmas collection) and our past shortfalls from our CSA target.

Both our MCC and AOD payables, which do not accrue interest, thankfully, have been rising astronomically. As you know, health care insurance premiums have tripled since 2000. Currently our monthly health care insurance premiums alone run us over \$9000. Our CSA shortfalls average about \$10,000 over the past three years and our AOD assessments average about \$32,000 a year from 2009 to 2015. While we can keep up with our normal other expenses like utilities quite well, our payables mentioned above have been taxing our annual budget to crisis proportions.

So what's the bottom line? Well, prepare to gasp, here goes. *Our current debts from the above mentioned payables run about \$550.00+* How could this happen? Well, it's like the distinction between your mortgage payments, which you can control and hopefully pay off in a set amount of time, and other expenses which you can't totally control. (if at all), e.g. rising health care cost, water bills, fuel costs for home and auto, etc. Let me say that we have made every effort to manage these expenses, but we're more like David facing Goliath. The world around us is what is it.

We also face significant challenges in keeping our school going. Our current debt relates to the Parish's subsidy to our school, which is so essential to keep Catholic education affordable in South Redford. Because of declining enrollment, MCC costs, out tuition rates and maintenance issues, we are operating at a significant deficit over the past two years or so.

So there we are. The issue now is, *will we rise to the challenge?* What's at stake is not only maintaining a vibrant parish and its Christ-like witness to our local community, but also providing quality Catholic education for the children of families who form a key part of our parish. At first we might feel shocked, angry to be sure, maybe even overwhelmed. But we are not alone. Believe me, my people, other parishes with the AOD are facing similar or even much great financial issues. Compared to them, our debt is 'peanuts' as they say, and I'm not trying to be funny. What are some next steps? Besides staying the course and keeping up or increasing your contributions (we are keeping up with our other expenses), we will provide a full-fledge Financial Report to be distributed either on the weekend of May 3rd or 10th. This will provide accurate information for your reflection before we hold a TOWN HALL meeting here at St. Robert's right after the 10:00 Mass on Sunday, June 7, in order to answer your questions, provide any needed additional information, and come up with significant action plans to meet our challenges.
